Just for your information. There were two white litigants before me. Her attitude and demeanor was much different than it was with me. I sat and watched her couch a white couple about being efficient, then I watched her coach a white girl on how to get a restrained order. But she didn't allow me to speak about my income.

Clearly, my husband didn't tell you about me. This now has become about being a black woman and not being treated equally. For my husband it's about money. My self worth isn't tide to money. My self worth is how I show up in others lives. How I make a difference.

Funny how now you have an answer, but when I questioned you previously you ignored me.

I respect you as a black woman, we all have to live our journey. There are 789 girls in my group. I coach them because they need coaching. Theirs mother's didn't teach them about womanhood. That's my purpose is to help alleviate suffering. You choose to earn a living helping a abusive alcoholic not support his wife. I know you're smart, I know you will use my words against me. I give you the opportunity to do what's right sister. You will learn from this experience and I warn you he will throw you under the bus if he has too. He was having an affair with an employee. She got fired and needed a letter of reference. Do you think he gave it to her?

In the time of "me too" and "times up" my husband's inappropriate use of power should also be of interest.

I am being treated unfairly, it's nothing new. When I have a fear my God shows up for me. I ask him forgiveness for the fear I carry. I don't sleep, I have anxiety but I know in my heart God will show up.

Let me share, black people died for you and I. They gave their life, and I take that very seriously. When I find myself being treated less than fair because of the skin color I do all that I can to make it right. Because I know so many women don't have the wherewithal.

Again God puts the right people in my life at the right time. So you decide how you want to be a part of these events. I know you see your white counterpart doing the unethical activity. You may think they are prospering, but Ariel it all comes out in the wash.
